State law now requires all businesses that generate 4 or more cubic yards of waste weekly to recycle. Multifamily Complexes of five or more units are also required to recycle.

Assembly Bill 341 MANDATORY RECYCLING

FOR BUSINESSES AND
APARTMENT COMPLEXES



EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2012

Going Green With Commercial Recycling

With the passage of Assembly Bill (AB) 341, businesses and public entities that generate four (4) cubic yards or more of waste per week and multifamily units of five (5) or more are required to recycle.

Businesses are required to recycle on and after **July 1, 2012**.

The purpose of this new law is to:

- **Reduce** greenhouse gas emissions by **diverting** commercial solid waste from landfills and;
- **Expand** opportunities for **recycling** in California, and the Salinas Valley
- **Conserve** natural **resources** to extend the life of our local landfill, Johnson Canyon.

How to get started:

- ⇒ It's easy to recycle: Make sure your business or apartment complex has arranged for recycling services (see back for more information).
- ⇒ Use the list on the side of this flyer to help learn what items can be recycled.
- ⇒ Separate recyclable items from the trash.
- ⇒ Place your recyclable items in external recycling containers for collection.

What CAN I Recycle?

It depends on the type of business, but the most common materials are:

• PAPER AND CARDBOARD

Cardboard (flattened), newspaper, magazines, paper packaging, phone books, books, office paper, junk mail, shredded paper in clear bags.



• PLASTICS

Bottles/containers and lids, rigid plastics such as, buckets, crates, plastic plant pots. Etc.



Plastic film

Shrink wrap, grocery bags, plastic bags from bread or produce, etc. Clean and dry bags ONLY



• METAL

Tin/steel cans, soda cans, empty aerosol cans, pots, pans, utensils and tools. Any other type of scrap metal.



• GLASS

Glass bottles and jars.



What CAN'T I recycle?

- Food
- Diapers
- Broken glass & ceramic
- Contaminated paper and cardboard
- Polystyrene Foam



Bulky Items

If your business generates bulky items please call your local hauler or the Salinas Valley Solid Waste Authority for disposal options. Fees may apply. See back for contact information.

- Furniture
- Appliances
- Mattresses/Spring Boxes
- Tires
- Electronic Waste

Do NOT place tires, electronics, or hazardous waste in recycling bins
