
#### **SVR Retirements and Promotions!**



Current Recycling Coordinator Mandy Brooks will become the department manager and Jenny Mitchell will move from Contracts and Grants Analyst to Recycling Coordinator. Congratulations to all!

### Operations and Waste Processed Report for Fiscal Year 2015-16

The amount of material processed and vehicle trips continue to increase. At the Sun Street facility, there was a 17% increase in vehicle trips compared to FY 2014-15 and a 67% increase compared to FY 2010-11. The Johnson Canyon facility vehicle trips increased 14% compared to last year. This fiscal year marks the first full year of Authority ran facility operations of Johnson Canyon. Staff achieved a 1,987 lbs./cy density compaction, which under the previous contractor agreement, would have resulted in a \$1,405,448 bonus payment. The actual Johnson Canyon operation costs by staff came in 27% below the previous operator's proposal and 12.5% under their own proposal. Well done SVR staff!
