Salinas Valley Recycles Annual Report for Fiscal Year 2015-16



The annual report highlighted, events, accomplishments, and costs saving measures of the past fiscal year, including the recovery of almost 20,000 tons of recyclables more than last year and completing all preparations to take over the operations of the Jolon Road Transfer Station. It also included a snap shot of the some of the major objectives completed over the past three years towards the achievement of the 2013-16 Strategic Plan Goals. The statistics reflected a slight increase in waste landfilled and the regional diversion

rate remained at 69% (excluding the County of Monterey, who reports to CalRecycle separately). Many events were held and sponsored throughout the community to continue promoting waste reduction and resource recovery and conservation, as we continue to work for a future without landfills.
