Avoid contamination fees and missed collections by reviewing your programs **every** year.





svswa.org/facilities/household-hazardouswaste-hhw-collection-facility SVR is a joint powers agency made up of the cities of Gonzales, Greenfield, King City, Soledad and Salinas and County of Monterey, and is responsible for providing secure long-term solid waste disposal and resource recovery service. SVR can provide free internal bins, labels, brochures, waste assessments, and trainings/presentations.

Republic Services is the franchised waste hauler that services Salinas that provides the weekly trash, recycling and food scrap collection services. They offer one free bulky item pick-up per year.

Waste Management is the franchised hauler that services King City and unincorporated Monterey County that provides the weekly trash, recycling and food scrap collection services. They offer free household battery recycling and bulky item pick-up by appointment.

Tri-Cities Disposal is the waste hauler for Soledad, Greenfield, and Gonzales that provides the weekly trash, recycling and food scrap collection services. They offer curbside used motor oil and oil filter pick-up, as well as free bulky-item pick up by appointment.

Residents can dispose of household hazardous waste (batteries, light bulbs, household cleaners, etc.) for free at the Household Hazardous Waste Facility. Visit the website for a list of accepted items and hauling limits.
