Implement mixed recycling for glass, metal, plastic, and paper




Assembly Bill 1826

Implement organic recycling program (yard waste)



Senate Bill 1383

- (1) Implement food scraps recycling program and;
- (2) Redirect edible food to those in need



FOOD SCRAPS / YARD WASTE

Leftover Food Scraps, Fruit & Vegetables, Cooked Meat, Dairy, Grains, Culls, Grass Clippings, Tree Trimmings, Leaves, Etc

SB 1383: How to Recycle Food Scraps



- Grass
- Weeds
- Leaves
- Branches
- Plant / Flower Trimmings
- Small pieces of Natural Wood (Unpainted/ Untreated)



- Vegetables + seeds
- Dairy & eggshells
- Cooked meat & seafood + bones & shells
- Bread, grains, pasta, & nut shells
- Coffee grounds
- Spoiled & uneaten food

What's NOT Accepted In The Carts

- Plastic or plastic bags
- Pet waste
- Garden hoses
- Paper paper plates, towel,cups
- Broken Lawn Chairs
- Flower pots
- Pressure treated or painted wood
- Bioplastics "compostable"



- Raw meat
- Liquids
- Fats, oils, grease
- Glass
- Metal
- Food Stickers
- Rubber bands
- Twist ties





ORGANICS & RECYCLING PROGRAM CHECKLIST Use this checklist to ensure your organics & recycling programs are set up for success. Avoid contamination fees and missed collections by reviewing your programs every year. Is my disposal area set up for success? There is a food scraps & recycle cart next to every trash cart or dumpste The waste area is well-maintained, and carts or dumpsters are not damaged or vandalized . . Residents have received a resource list for bulky items, hazardous waste, etc. Property Manager has coordinated a yearly or more frequent bulky items pick-up for residents If you answered "NO" to any statement above, contact your waste hauler or Salinas Valley Recycles to discuss ways to improve your disposal area. Is it easy for the residents to recycle? All recycle carts are clearly labeled. There is signage on what to recycle near/behind the carts or dumpsters. All residents have received recycling information in the past 12 months. There are reminders on how to recycle correctly in community newsletters/spaces If you answered "NO" on any statement above, contact your waste hauler or Salinas Valley Do I need to make any adjustments to my service? There are recyclables (ie: metal, clean paper) or food scraps in the trash. There is trash (ie: plastic bags, dog/cat poop) in the recycle and/or food scraps The recycle and/or food scrap cart(s) are full before collection The trash is less than 75% full before it is picked up. . If you answered "YES" on any statement above, contact your waste hauler to change your service levels. Worried about the "ick" factor when collecting food scraps? We've listed a few effective ideas to help keep your food scraps program successful!




- Use a kitchen container that works for you, such as a kitchen pail. Or you can just repurpose an old container: large yogurt or ice cream tubs are a great nocost option!
- Freeze it Scraps can be stored in the freezer or refrigerator to avoid or reduce odors.
- Use a lid A tight fitting lid on your container will help keep flies away. A <u>vented</u> lid will prevent flies and prevent anaerobic (rotting) stink!
- Wash your kitchen container thoroughly with detergent as needed. Most containers are dishwasher safe as well!



- Put fruit or melon scraps immediately into your food and yard waste cart and cover.
- Sprinkle baking soda in your kitchen container to reduce odors.



- Try adding yard waste, like weeds or grass, at the bottom
- Keep carts out of direct sunlight, if possible
- Keep lids CLOSED
- Encourage residents to use troubleshooting tips
