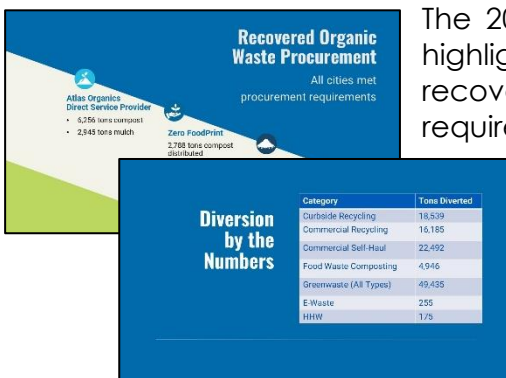

CALRECYCLE'S TIRE AMNESTY GRANT

Once again, the Authority was awarded the Tire Amnesty Grant from CalRecycle. The grant will fund free waste-tire collection events at all three of the Authority's facilities during Spring- Summer 2026, Fall 2026, and Spring-Summer 2027 helping to divert tires from the landfill. The events will align, when possible, with community cleanup events held by local waste haulers. The program aims to reduce environmental and public-health risks from improper tire disposal and provide education on proper recycling. Residents within the Authority's jurisdiction will be informed of the free disposal opportunities through multiple communication channels, including social media, flyers, print and radio ads, email notices, the Authority's website, and bill inserts or newsletters. 2024 AB 939 ELECTRONIC ANNUAL REPORT



The 2024 AB 939 Electronic Annual Report (EAR) was presented and highlighted the progress in organic waste procurement, edible food recovery, and community outreach. All cities met procurement requirements, with thousands of tons of compost and mulch supplied through direct service provider agreements with Atlas Organics, Zero FoodPrint, and the RCD's Healthy Soils initiative. The Authority attended 77 outreach workshops, reached over 57,000 residents/business, distributed over 2,000 brochures, and posted 50 short videos on education, inspiration, and agency awareness. ADOPTION OF ORDINANCE NO. 12

The second reading by title only of Ordinance No. 12 to amend the Authority Code to increase the Chief Administrative Officer's purchasing authorities from \$50,000 to \$100,000 was conducted. The amendment aligns with economic increases since 1999 and streamlines the procurement process for supplies, equipment, service and public works projects. This ordinance will take effect 30 days after the adoption date.

NOMINATING COMMITTEE FOR THE 2026 ELECTION OF OFFICERS

The selection of the Nominating Committee took place. All three current officers have served a one-year term in their current office and are eligible for reappointment in the same position as per the Authority Code guidelines. The Committee will be contacting the officers to inquire about their interest in serving one more year as has been done historically. New officers will be selected at the January 22, 2026 Board meeting.
